Constitutions and Bylaws of the Cranbrook Quilters' Guild

Article 1 NAME

This organization shall be known as the Cranbrook Quilters' Guild and hereinafter referred to as the Guild.

Article 2 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Guild are as follows:

- a. To provide a forum for quilters to meet and exchange ideas and help others, to hold workshops and seminars.
- b. To work on community projects as the need arises.
- c. To preserve the art of quilt making in the Cranbrook area.
- d. To maintain a lending library of resources.

Article 3 MEMBERSHIPS

Membership is open to anyone interested in quilting, on payment of a prescribed annual fee. Our year runs from September to June.

- a. Membership entitles the members to:
 - 1. Participate in meetings including the annual General Meeting (excluding executive meetings)
 - 2. Participate in workshops, seminars and Guild quilt shows.
 - 3. Participate in special social events.
 - 4. Sign out library resources.
 - 5. Members' fee includes annual membership to the Cranbrook Seniors Centre which entitles members to take part in any and all activities at the centre.
- b. The annual fee shall be paid by the third business meeting of the year. Members joining mid-year shall pay the full prescribed annual fee.
- c. Members are encouraged to make and donate a community quilt annually. Some fabric and batting is available from the guild upon request.
- d. New members will receive a membership card, a copy of the Constitution and Bylaws, Common Practices, membership roster and the pattern for the guild name tag.
- e. Existing members can request a copy of the Constitution and Bylaws and Common Practices.

Article 4 EXECUTIVE

The Executive of the Guild shall be comprised of Past President, President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

- a. Standing committees shall be as follows:
 - 1. Programs
 - 2. Workshops
 - 3. Membership
 - 4. Hospitality
 - 5. Sunshine
 - 6. Historian
 - 7. Publicity (which includes Facebook and Website)
 - 8. Library
 - 9. Community Quilts
 - 10. Ad Hoc committees as considered necessary
- b. Any elected member or chair of a standing committee who is in neglect of their duties may be terminated for just cause.
- c. Membership may be terminated for just cause or failure to uphold the Bylaws by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the executive and standing committees.
- d. In the event that a duly elected officer or standing committee chair cannot complete her role of office, the executive shall appoint a member to carry out the term of that office.
